Chilled Beam Lecture Recap

Last month we had a presentation on “Psychrometrics of Chilled Beam Systems” by Don Larsson, a local ASHRAE member and member of TC 5.3. This topic was chosen to dispel the often used fear of “Rain in my Building”. It appears that engineers are reluctant to design and specify chilled beam systems for fear of condensation accumulation and the resulting building damage. As chilled beams have only sensible cooling capabilities, the space dew point temperature must be controlled to a point lower than the chilled water temperature of the chilled beams. This prevents condensation from forming on the beams as well as the piping and control valves.

An understanding of the psychrometric conditions of the space will prevent the formation of condensation within the controlled space. Dedicated Outside Air Systems, (DOAS), are one way of controlling both space dew point temperature and space pressurization.

A simple calculation of moisture content and DOAS supply volume can be solved for the correct DOAS dew point supply temperature. The lower the DOAS supply volume, the lower the DOAS supply dew point must be in order to maintain the space dew point. Provided that the space dew point temperature is satisfactory, the chilled beams can do all the space sensible cooling. This results in a very efficient environmental control system.

Don will be one of three presenters at the ASHRAE summer meeting in Long Beach in June on this same topic. There will also be presentations on Successful Chilled Beam Installations in high wet bulb areas of the US.
